Scholarships give career kick-start to gifted young scientists

Talented scientists and engineers of the future are to benefit from a £750,000 scholarship fund.

Some 70 students from around the world will be able to study for undergraduate degrees at the University of Edinburgh thanks to the scheme, funded by global logistics company Deutsche Post DHL through the DHL UK Foundation.

Students who qualify for the scholarships will receive £2,000 each year for up to five years of their course.

The scheme is scheduled to support 14 or 15 science and engineering students each year, and will operate for 10 years in total, beginning in autumn 2015.

The initiative is intended to support aspiring young people of limited means to pursue a world-class education in science.

Students selected to take part may also benefit from placement opportunities and exchange programmes at DHL's UK business divisions.
