Course Innovation

At the Edinburgh Futures Institute, I coordinate with course organizers to plan and deliver hybrid and fusion-style
learning within the Edinburgh Futures Institute. The position involves a high degree of coordination, planning,
communication and organization to ensure on-site learners and virtual learners have a seamless experience in
their course. Additionally, I use my technology skills to facilitate the intensive learning style on MS Teams, support
the course organizer with classroom configuration, and moderate discussions and break-out rooms.

Teaching

- In my sessional academic roles at the University of Calgary and Mount Royal University, I delivered lectures on
 plot, character, grammar, technical writing and communications, and prepared accelerated syllabus for online
 delivery. I maintained office hours, graded assignments, and provided feedback to students to enhance learning.
- At the Edinburgh Future's Institute, I co-lectured on Writing Speculative Fiction and lead writing workshops.

Storytelling

As a writer, I have published short stories in literary journals, anthologies and magazines in Canada, the US,
 Europe and UK. I've also developed long format narratives in fiction and non-fiction for multiple formats including print, digital, multimedia, and audio, and work collaboratively with editors and illustrators.

Academic Knowledge

My doctoral research builds on the research of Meg Mundell, an Australian researcher, who developed a new model on literary place-making. Furthermore, I contributed new research to build on Mundell's POET model, a tool for how creative writers craft literary places. I have proposed a new subset of spatial engagement to the POET model under the 'nebulous' category which I've labelled as instantaneous capturing.

- I have produced digital assets to enhance my research on instantaneous capturing, as well as videos which capture liminal spaces, as an example of how my model relates to the field of creative writing.
- I have also drawn on the field of Gothic Studies and conducted a literature review on scholarly work in this field. I
 met with researchers at the International Gothic Association Conference this summer, where I shared my
 research with a global network and engaged in knowledge exchange.
- I will present my contributions to the POET model at the Great Writing Conference in London, England in 2025.

Development of Others

- I served as the managing editor of The Selkie Publications CIC from 2017 to 2020, where I edited and reviewed manuscripts, made publishing decisions, and line managed a team of twenty global volunteer editors for an anthology project, which I received \$15,000 in grant funding for.
- In 2021, I launched Radical Bookshop and Press, a small publishing company intended to help writers kickstart
 their careers by publishing small format short stories, chapbooks and novellas. I hired two senior editors to
 oversee editorial duties including reviewing submissions, overseeing editorial changes, and working with authors
 the vision for the titles.

Wider Research and Innovation

- I was selected to attend the Gifford Lecture Series this year featuring Dr Cornel West where I crafted a response to
 his third lecture titled Folly Presto, which linked with academic research on Toni Morrison's novel Jazz from my
 master's program. It was a great opportunity to partner with the School of Divinity on topics of religion, philosophy
 and tragedy which sit outside my typical research.
- In 2022, I was invited to partner with The Lougheed House Museum on an exhibition exploring the history of Calgary's Chinatown and the Exclusion Act through the contribution of a short story based on George Ho Lem. I worked with historians, librarians and city planners to write a short story reflective of Ho Lem's life, and collaborated with an illustrator to create an interactive display which toured multiple Canadian cities.
- In 2025, I was selected to lead a Spring into Research Methods workshop with the Scottish Graduate School or Social Sciences. I shared my academic methodology and interdisciplinary research methods with doctoral students studying at St Andrews, Glasgow, Edinburgh and Dundee.

- Engaged in discussion with historians at the University of Edinburgh at the panel talk on *Following the Money:* Book Collecting in the Age of Slavery with Professor Emma Smith from the University of Oxford.
